# LGBTQ+ Pride Month & Juneteenth

## Juneteenth, June 19th

<u>Juneteenth</u> "is the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States." On June 19<sup>th</sup>, 1865, Union General Gordon Granger announced **General Order No. 3** to the people of Galveston, TX – "The people are informed that in accordance with the Proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free."

## Caring for Transgender and Gender Diverse Patients

There are approximately **1.4 million** trans adults in the U.S. There are an estimated **35,950 trans identified adults and youth in Washington**. UW Medicine has over:

- 7,522 Transgender & Gender Non-Binary (TGNB) identified patients
- Over 8,000 TGNB visit encounters in 2021
- 414 surgical visits, 60% gender affirming surgeries in 2021

Though health disparities are significant, **gender affirming care** lowers the risk of suicide attempts and mental health crises. Faculty, trainees, and staff can take steps to create an inclusive environment for trans and gender diverse people in our clinical spaces, research studies, and workplaces.

- Address implicit biases about trans and gender non-binary people.
- Wear "Badge Buddies" with your pronouns.
- If you misgender or deadname (use the name they used before transitioning) someone, correct yourself and move on. Thank someone for correcting you.




