Dr. Virginia Apgar is one of the most notable anesthesiologists in the world. She was a pioneer in the field in the 1960s and is known for her contributions on neonatal transitional physiology and resuscitation. Visit <u>The Wood Library-Museum</u> to learn more about Dr. Apgar and her legacy.

While there is gender parity among medical school graduates, this has not translated to parity among practicing physicians. Women represent 35% of anesthesiology residents and 36% of all full-time faculty in academic anesthesiology in the USA. Women in anesthesiology experience a variety of challenges in their career paths: gender bias in the workplace, unequal representation in positions of leadership and pay disparity - with male anesthesiologists earning up to 30% more.

<u>Women in Anesthesiology (WIA)</u> is a physician organization committed to the professional and personal development of women anesthesiologists. It supports the recruitment, retention, and job satisfaction of women in anesthesiology, promoting a culture of inclusivity and diversity. The Seattle/Western Washington state chapter has several leaders from our own department.



Diversity Council Highlights


