# Native American Heritage Month

## **FACTS**

American Indians/Alaska Natives (AI/AN) have long experienced lower health status when compared with other Americans. Their life expectancy is <u>5.5</u> years less than the U.S. all-races population. Pain symptoms and painful conditions are highly prevalent in the American Indian/Alaska Native population—which is often under-treated due to provider bias.

The <u>UW Indian Health Pathway (IHP) Certificate Program</u> enhances opportunities for Native and non-Native medical students to learn how to integrate AI/AN communities' cultural, spiritual and traditional needs in healthcare settings.

#### INTERVENTION

To improve access to healthcare and education, clinicians should participate in health programs **such as IHP**, that are led by AI/AN communities. In a clinical setting, providers must be aware of **implicit bias** when **diagnosing pain** in AI/AN patients and **exercising safe opioid-prescribing practices**.






