Native American Heritage Month

November is Native American Heritage Month

American Indians/ Alaska Natives (AI/AN) are twice as likely to live in poverty, compared to the general US population (29% vs 16%). In addition, they represent one of the highest percentages (40%) among all racial groups living in rural areas. Als/ANs have the highest rate of diabetes in the US (15.9% vs. 9.3% in the general population), later diagnoses, and high rates of death from liver disease and cirrhosis [Gebauer S. J Palliat Med. 2016 Dec;19(12):1331-1340].

Minority groups remain underrepresented in medical specialties, including anesthesiology. Out of 6272 anesthesia residents surveyed in 2019, only 0.3% identified as AI/AN. [Brotherton SE. Graduate Medical Education, 2019-2020. JAMA. 2020;324(12):1230–1250]. Being treated by doctors that share the same demographics as patients improves communication and decreases disease impact.

Useful recommendations:

- Treat each patient as an individual, and each situation as unique, but also be aware of cultural practices, spiritual beliefs, and norms in your community.
- Monitor nonverbal cues in conversation, use silence, and listen actively
- An emphasis in pipeline programs for medical school and residency applicants
 can help achieve workforce diversity, but it should also be paired with fostering
 an inclusive work environment to improve retention of minority physicians.




