While **12.3%** of the population in WA state is Hispanic/Latinx, only **3.2%** of Physicians in WA state were. At the UWSOM for the year 2018, **3.5% of Faculty**, **7.1% of residents and 5% of UW medical students were Hispanic/Latinx**. In addition to recruitment and retention efforts to increase the number of Latinx physicians, the UWSOM is focused on improving the knowledge about Latinx health through the **SOM Latinx health pathway**.


