#### Women's Equality Day, August 26

Women's Equality Day marks the adoption of the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment, which prohibited states from denying the right to vote based on sex. This year, we celebrate women leaders in the department and the University of Washington.

Research demonstrates gender inequities in our field. Developing women leaders in anesthesiology is important to bring diverse perspectives to our specialty and requires a programmatic and intentional approach. As we strive to be more inclusive and equitable in our workplace to better serve our educational and patient care mission, there are steps we can begin to take:

- Mentorship & Sponsorship: Sponsoring of early- and mid-career women for conferences, lectures, and other opportunities facilitates recognition at local, national, and international levels. This is key for promotion and consideration for leadership roles.
- Recruitment & Retention: The development of more equitable screening and interviewing processes is ongoing within the department. Similar initiatives at other institutions have yielded much success.
- Purposeful Representation: Representation of women with intersectional identities should be intentional in all processes and decisions within the organization to ensure diverse perspectives are included.


