Latinos: Driving Prosperity, Power and Progress in America

The theme of this year's National Hispanic Heritage Month celebrates the impact and contributions of Latine and Hispanic Americans. October 1 is <u>National Latino Physician Day</u>. Celebrate Hispanic and Latinx physicians in the U.S. and to help build awareness and bridge the gap in representation. In WA 3.1% of physicians identify as Hispanic or Latino as compared with 14% of the state's population.

Recently published in the journal Pediatrics, researchers have linked <u>state-level anti-immigrant</u> <u>sentiment and policies to negative health outcomes in US Latino children</u>. This study demonstrates the importance of focusing on macro-level social determinants of health in children. In a commentary also published in Pediatrics, **Dr. Nathalia Jimenez, our Vice Chair for Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion, stated, "this places the findings within the realm of public policy with a call to action to address state mandates that directly affect individual children.**"
