Whether we are discussing abolitionists like Sojourner Truth, women educators like Sarah Doyle, or the first woman of color to serve as a House Representative—and key Title IX author—Patsy Mink, women have been conduits of change throughout history.

This year's theme, "Women who Advocate for DEI," highlights the power of women in leadership and the change they are enacting across the globe. (Beeman, 2021) highlighted the fact that less than 10% of all full-time faculty are women of color (Black, Hispanic, Asian, Pacific Islander, or Native American), and according to the AAMC Specialty Data Report, women made up 36% of the physician workforce in 2020. However, many of these women play a major part in directly and indirectly moving forward DEI initiatives.


Highlighting women in our department


