Global Initiatives Month

This month we are highlighting global initiatives that are positively impacting health outcomes around the world.

Our department's <u>Global Anesthesia INitiative</u> (<u>UW-GAIN</u>) promotes equitable care for all in need of essential anesthesia and surgical services worldwide. More than 50 APM faculty members are involved in global efforts in <u>35 countries</u> around the world, utilizing their expertise to impact global education partnerships, curriculum development, quality improvement, and global disease research, as well as national and international anesthesia societies.

This year, UW-GAIN has partnered with faculty from the University of Nairobi, the Society for Pediatric Anesthesia of Kenya (SPAK), and the World Federation Society of Anesthesia (WFSA) to focus on safer surgery for pediatric patients in low-resource areas. In March, UW-GAIN faculty and our Kenyan partners taught the *Safer Anesthesia from Education* (SAFE) course to 24 clinicians in Nakuru county.

UW-GAIN also offers training opportunities for APM trainees and anesthesiologists in partnering countries. Since 2018, UW-GAIN has hosted anesthesiologists from low and middle-income countries to observe at the University of Washington and participate in the ASA/SPA annual meetings. UW-GAIN also offers a faculty-fellowship program in global health.

The leadership and dedication of our faculty make this work possible. Thank you for all you do!




- May 20: Inaugural resident-faculty global health journal club.
